UL Opens Book of Condolence for Counselor David A.B. Jallah

Capitol Hill, UL Relations, 5th June 2018:--A three-day book of condolence to pay respect to the memory of the late Counselor David A. B. Jallah, Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel of the University of Liberia, will be opened on Wednesday, June 6, 2018, at 10 A.M., and placed for signing in the Ruth S. Morgenthau Reading Room of the Louis Arthur Grimes School of Law on Capitol Hill.

The President of the University of Liberia Dr. Ophelia Inez Weeks is expected to lead an array of officials of the University of Liberia, including deans, chairs, faculty, staff, students and alumni to sign the book of condolence.

In announcing the signing of the book of condolence, Dr. Weeks said Counselor Jallah was a valuable member of the University of Liberia family for more than three decades, who served with distinction at the highest level of the university administration, including Dean of the Louis Arthur Grimes School of School for more than 15 years, as well as the first General Counsel of the University of Liberia, a position he honorably served for three years until his unexpected death on Monday, May 21, 2018.

The three-day's signing of the book of condolence runs from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily until Friday, June 8, 2018.

Dr. Weeks further disclosed that the book of condolence is just the beginning of a series of honors the university intends to bestow upon the memory of Counselor Jallah posthumously, adding that a number of recommendations are being made to the Board of Trustees of the University of Liberia that are enduring legacies through which counselor Jallah would be forever remembered.

Meanwhile, Counselor T. Negabalee Warner, Dean of the Louis Arthur Grimes School of Law, is urging all staff, faculty and the general student body of the of the law school to attend all activities, including the signing of the book of condolence on tomorrow, the removal of the body, a short vigil at the UL Capitol Hill Campus, and at the funeral.
